Phase IV: Capacity Specifications by Industry / Activity

The City of Chicago continues to experience COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations, which left unchecked poses a risk to our healthcare system. It is more important than ever to follow guidance from local, state, and federal officials on how to stop the spread of the virus. Currently, Chicago is in Phase IV of its reopening plan. In addition to this document, **establishments should also reference industry-specific Gradually Resume guidelines** at chicago.gov/reopening, all of which include strict adherence to physical distancing, masking, health screening and sanitation protocols. **In each setting, six feet of physical distance must be maintained between different parties. If necessary, facilities should operate a lower capacity to achieve six feet between all parties.**

Capacity restrictions by setting include:

Higher education	Classrooms and programming at colleges, universities, trade schools, and other institutions of higher learning	Limit classrooms, cafeterias, and other common spaces capacity to 50% occupancy with no more than 50 people per room	Limit classrooms, cafeterias, and other common spaces capacity to 60% occupancy
Short term rentals	Short-term living accommodations, vacation rentals, and other homestays	Limit gatherings of guests to no more than 10 individuals in a single rental property or associated building common area/room, following building and individual property owner guidance	Limit gatherings to vaccinated individuals or single households when possible
Taxi & ride hail	Taxis and other ride sharing services	Restrict taxis or ride-hail vehicles to no more than 9 individuals, including the driver	Restrict taxis or ride-hail vehicles to no more than 9 individuals, including the driver
